## Bram Peart, Park Ranger for Highland and Mellon Parks

- Housed in City Dept of Public Safety
- Other HP ranger is Sam (Samantha)

- Started as a Park Ranger in June 2015
- Four responsibilities:
  - Patrol parks (mainly RAD parks) in order to enforce park related ordinances and ensure safety.
  - First responders in park (usually direct police & EMS where to go)
  - Service events (planting trees, etc.)
  - Educational programming (tabling every Thursday, 4:30-6 pm until school gets out - alternate b/w the Farmhouse Playground & Super Playground; during summer, 10 - 12; same thing in Frick on Tuesday)
- Easter Egg Hunt Saturday, March 23rd, 10 A.M. at the Super Playground
  - 200 + children have registered to attend; with a grand total of close to 400, including parents, in attendance!
- They can come to our events if we give them a heads up, including Reservoir of Jazz
- Archery program to cull deer herd; plan to expand into Highland Park
  - Last year's culling took out 108 deer which only really will maintain the population
  - Had lots of applications to hunt, but about 50% failed the test
  - Donate the meat to the food banks (hunters are required to donate their first deer)
  - All the parks have an overpopulation of deer to different degrees
  - Deer diseases have increased as have vehicular accidents
  - Ruled out trapping high mortality rate and very expensive
  - Birth control is expensive and hard to be effective (it goes into the drinking water and it's hard to get enough deer to do it; and it's illegal in PA)
